Still waiting

Cortland cannabis shop left out of recent license approvals

Paul Suits Jr., filed his application to open LakeHouse Cannabis in Cortland three years ago. His business is No. 2,026 in line, and the state has reviewed, perhaps, 800 applications.

The state announced recently that it has issued 403 adult-use cannabis licenses so far this year.

Suits is still waiting.

"They've sped up the review a little bit, it seems," Suits said Monday. "My optimistic estimate is two to three months. If they keep dragging things out, it could be six months."

Suits said now that three years have passed since LakeHouse registered with the state, the situation has become frustrating.

"I'm confident things will work in the long run," Suits said.

Suits said the last he checked, the Office of Cannabis Management, which has been criticized for its handling of the program's rollout, was working through the 800s.

On Friday Gov. Kathy Hochul said the Cannabis Control Board has issued 403 adult-use cannabis licenses this year, an announcement made about a month after Hochul said the state Office of General Services is auditing the state's cannabis management agencies.

The audit is expected to be published Thursday, followed by a more in-depth report after another 60 days.

Stores in cities within an hour of Cortland, Syracuse, Ithaca, Binghamton, Johnson City, have received approvals, according to state information.

However, approvals aren't based on population. An application's position in the state's queue order determines the order in which the office will begin the review of each application, says the office's website.

"The queue's order does not indicate the order in which licenses will be issued," the cannabis management office's website says.

Suits said the delay has two reasons: the fact cannabis is a new industry; and state staffing issues and competence.

"There's a lot of inefficiency," Suits said. "I know people who've waited a year to get a liquor license."

Still, Suits said he is optimistic LakeHouse will open its doors some time in 2024.
